You will work as member the ICT Applications Team who are responsible for all systems used within the Service; from back-office systems such as Finance to front line systems such as Mobile Data Terminals on our fire appliance. The successful applicant will work alongside our existing ICT Trainers to design and deliver training across the Service, from our Fire Service Headquarters to out and about at our Fire Stations.

Our approach to training is generally one to one or small groups and tends to be needs based as opposed to formal. This can be delivered face to face or via Microsoft Teams. The role would suit someone who is flexible in their approach and who likes to meet people and problem solve. We also carry out some formal training in the form of Master Classes, these can be held at any location within the Service and are based around improving skills in Office applications. This is a great opportunity for someone who wants to be part of dynamic team, has great people skills, and embraces the fact that every day will be different.

Welsh language skills are desirable but not essential for this post.

Additional Benefits include flexible working, on-site gym, and pool cars available for travelling off-site. The successful candidate will be subject to a satisfactory Disclosure and Barring Service check and be required to undertake a Drug and Alcohol Test prior to an appointment being made.
